General rules: Any regularly enrolled 4-H or FFA member who has satisfactorily completed his/her projects for the 2009 club year may participate in the exhibits and contests pertaining to his/her projects. Articles to be exhibited must be made, raised or collected during the current club year. Exhibits entered in the 4-H & FFA Department may not be entered in any other Fair department. Leaders/ advisors will be asked to certify completion of projects. See Rule Book, page 7, for complete information.

ENTRY TAGS: The Extension Office will print all entry tags. They will be provided at the time entries are received in the 4-H building and must be securely fastened to each exhibit. Photography judging will occur prior to the Fair. Entry tags for photography need to be attached on bottom right or left to show exhibitors name, club, etc. when displayed.

Building exhibits are **limited to a total of 50 entries per exhibitor**. No exhibits will be released before 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, September 27. The Danish Grouping System will be used in judging 4-H Club exhibits. **CHAMPION AND RESERVE CHAMPION MAY BE AWARDED TO AN OUTSTANDING EXHIBIT IN EACH DIVISION AT THE JUDGE'S DISCRETION.** No premium monies will be awarded.

Group exhibits will be accepted for any division. Each member in the group will receive a ribbon. A Champion and Reserve Champion Group Exhibit may be awarded at the judge's discretion.

Members who are involved in 4-H School Enrichment or Outreach 4-H Projects may enter up to two items per division. **These members are not eligible for the Champion Building Exhibitor Awards.**

Champion Building Exhibitors - A Junior & Senior Champion and Reserve Champion Building Exhibitor may be awarded. Champions will receive a buckle, Reserve will receive a rosette.

- 1) Member must submit an entry form indicating Champion Exhibitor Eligibility by August 15.
- 2) Member must submit entries completed within the year in at least 3 different project areas.
- 3) Member must receive at least 3 blues on these entries and one Grand or Reserve Champion.
- 4) Project records must be available on request. Incomplete records will result in disqualification for Champion Building Exhibitor.
- 5) A point system will be used to determine champion and reserve champion exhibitors. Five points will be awarded for each division Grand Champion; four points will be given for each Reserve Champion per division, and three points for each blue ribbon.

- 6) Tie Breaker - Other exhibit ribbons will be totaled using two points for red ribbons and one point for white ribbons until a clear winner can be established.

FOOD PREPARATION

Members enrolled in the 4-H Foods Project may exhibit **three items per class**. 4-H'ers are encouraged to exhibit food items that utilize skills learned in the project.

Exhibitor must **submit the recipe** for each entry, recipe should be typed and on a 3x5 card wrapped in plastic wrap or placed in a plastic bag. Any entry that does not include the recipe will not be eligible for Grand and Reserve Champion honors. If project has been frozen this should be indicated and reasons given; freezing will affect products if not done properly so use caution. Exhibitor must state age and years in project on entry form.

Quality of Foods Exhibits

Each food item entered should be of high quality standards and attractively prepared. The judges can disqualify any product in this division that does not reach 4-H food standards. Any product not meeting specifications will be for exhibit only, and receive a participation ribbon.

Foods exhibited in this division **MUST NOT** contain perishable fillings or toppings such as: Creams, Eggs, Custard, Meat,

Meat and Vegetable Combinations. Foods requiring refrigeration will not be accepted. **All exhibits must be on rigid cardboard or strong paper plates (candy, cookies, muffins or brownies - 5 per plate) and covered with a ziploc bag. DO NOT PUT BREAD INTO ZIPLOC TYPE BAGS**, place the entire, uncut loaf on a paper plate and cover it in plastic wrap. These classes are open to any member currently enrolled in any of the 4-H food projects.

Chocolate Chip Cookies Recipe
Makes 3 - 4 dozen

- 1 cup butter
- ½ cup white sugar
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 eggs
- 2 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips

Directions

1. Cream butter, sugar, and vanilla. Then stir in eggs. Put flour on top of the mixture and add soda and salt, mix a little, then mix together with rest of ingredients. Add chocolate chips and mix again.
2. Drop by spoonfuls on cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees F for about 10 minutes.

FOOD PRESERVATION

All fruits and vegetables must be in standard pint or quart jars. Dried fruits and vegetables should be on paper plates. Plates must be covered with a ziploc bag. 4. **All entries must be labeled on the center back** with the following: name, age and year in 4-H, when photo was taken, type of camera used and printing process used (by self in lab or on computer, print shop, web service, etc.).
5. An exhibitor may enter each photo only once; therefore a photo entered in color can not be entered in black and white.
